Program Description

Safe Routes to School (SRTS) was originally established as a stand-alone Federal-Aid program in August 2005 through the passage of SAFETEA-LU, the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users. The Illinois Safe Routes to School Program is administered by the Illinois Department of Transportation.

SRTS uses a multidisciplinary approach to improve conditions for students who walk or bike to school. The program has three main goals: 1) to enable and encourage children, including those with disabilities, to walk and bicycle to school, 2) to make bicycling and walking to school a safer and more appealing transportation alternative, thereby encouraging a healthy and active lifestyle from an early age, and 3) to facilitate the planning, development, and implementation of projects and activities that will improve safety and reduce traffic, fuel consumption, and air pollution in the vicinity (within 2 miles) of both public and private primary, middle schools, and high schools (grades K-12).

These goals are achieved through providing 100% reimbursable funding for Infrastructure and Non-infrastructure projects.

Eligible Infrastructure projects include Sidewalk Improvements, Traffic Calming/Speed Reduction Improvements, Traffic Control Devices, Pedestrian and Bicycle Crossing Improvements, On-Street Bicycle Facilities, Off-Street Bicycle Facilities, and Secure Bicycle Parking Facilities.

Eligible Non-infrastructure projects include a Walk & Roll to School Day or a Bike & Roll to School Day, a Bicycle Rodeo or Bicycle Safety Skills Clinic, a Student Pedestrian and Bike Safety educational event, a traffic garden (temporary, semi-permanent, or permanent), developing a crossing guard training program, walking school bus events, school/school district safe routes plan and evaluations for students, walkability and bikability checklist events, and many more.
