Projects will be funded at a maximum ratio of 80% federal funds to 20% local funds. Matching funds must be provided in cash, as in-kind contributions are not permitted. Utility relocation, construction engineering, and construction are eligible for funding at a maximum ratio of 80% federal funds to 20% local funds. The maximum allowable construction engineering amount is 15% of the total construction cost (based on construction subtotal minus ineligible items). Utility relocations cannot be 50% or more of the project's total construction costs. Right-of-way acquisition are eligible for funding at a maximum ratio of 50% federal funds to 50% local funds. Right-of-way acquisition may be included only as a part of the cost for the entire project, not as a stand-alone project.

In order to be eligible for enhancement funding, a project must be located on public property and must demonstrate a relationship to surface transportation. The enhancement projects must enhance the transportation system either by serving a transportation need or providing a transportation use or benefit. Activities are not eligible if they are routine maintenance projects such as re-striping a trail, cleaning up debris or repairing broken curb.

Projects involving sidewalks will be required to update the facility to meet current ADA Accessibility Standards. That would include, but not be limited to, curb cuts and handicapped ramps at intersections and corrective measures to fix cross slopes that exceed the ADA standards. In this example, curb cuts for the disabled would be eligible since they are required as a part of the overall project

Eligible project sponsors, must be located within the Rockford Metropolitan Planning Area, and represent the following entities: Local governments, regional transportation authorities, transit agencies, natural resource or public land agency, school district, tribal government, and any other local or regional governmental entity with responsibility for oversight of transportation or recreational trails

### **Evaluation & Scoring**

#### Criteria

MPO staff will evaluate and score applications using the following selection criteria and relative weighting (maximum of 112 points):

System Performance: Traffic Volume/AADT (Max. 5 points); Functional Classification (Max. 5 points); # of TSMO Strategies Incorporated (Max. 5 points)

Safety: Crash Rate (Max. 5 points); Fatal and Serious Injury Crash Rate (Max. 5 points); Non-motorized Crash Rate (Max. 5 points); Safety Strategies Incorporated (Max. 5 points)

Connectivity: Provides access to essential services (Max. 28 points); Community Connectivity (Max. 2 points); Justice 40/DCEO Underserved Area (Max. 10 points)

Economic Linkages: Supports a Commercial or Industrial Area (Max. 15 points)

Environmental Resiliency: Incorporates green infrastructure and design approaches that address air and water quality (Max. 5 points)

Investment & Coordination: % Non-federal Match (Max. 1 point); Continues an already completed 3R project (Max. 1 point); Benefits multiple communities (Max 1 point); # of Partners (Max. 1 Point); Project Sponsor Ranking (Max. 1 point)

Project Delivery & Readiness: Previous Delivery Performance (Max. 4 points); Project readiness (Max. 8 points)

NOTE: Please note that the above listed project evaluation criteria will be discussed at the September 19, 2024 MPO Technical Committee meeting for recommendation and the October 1, 2024 MPO Policy Committee meeting for adoption. Any modifications to the project evaluation criteria that result from the upcoming MPO Technical Committee and MPO Policy Committee meetings will be reflected in the application and notice of changes in the evaluation criteria will be posted to the MPO website and distributed through our mailing list.

#### Review & Selection Process

For any transportation alternative project located within MPO Adjusted Urbanized Area, the MPO follows a process for the assignment of Transportation Alternative Program funds. As part of this process, there is also an understanding that TA funds are distributed equitably in the entire MPO planning area. The MPO follows a process for the purpose of determining how the area's allocated Transportation Alternatives Program funds shall

be used. The steps of this process are outlined below.

Step 1 – Solicitation of Projects: The official selection process starts with the Call for Projects and interested agencies completing the appropriate application to apply for the TAP funding prior to the start of the annual TIP preparation procedure which typically begins in March of each year. To the extent possible, and for the purpose of easing the task of comparing projects that are competing for the same funds, an application form will need to be submitted Download the application here: www.r1planning.org

Step 2 - Staff Review & Scoring: MPO staff will review the proposed project applications for completeness and verify that the project is located within the Rockford Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA). MPO staff will conduct an initial project selection to determine if the submitted project will proceed to the evaluation process. If the project does not clear the initial selection process the applicant will be notified and may be provided an opportunity to submit additional information to support approval of the project. The MPO will use the eligibility criteria detailed above as the initial selection process.

After the initial selection process, based on the project eligibility criteria, the MPO will collect the data for reviewers to evaluate and score applications using the MPO Project Evaluation Criteria. Five evaluation criteria are used to score the projects based on MPO evaluation process to select and prioritize projects to receive TAP funding. The total possible score that any project can receive is 112 points.

After completion of the evaluation process, MPO staff will prepare a priority list with all of the projects evaluated based on the ranking system. Staff will then submit the priority list to the TA Selection Committee for consideration and project recommendation.

Step 3 - Committee Review & Allocate Funds: Once MPO staff has submitted the priority list to the MPO Alternative Transportation Committee will meet and discuss the proposed candidates' project submittals. Proposals will be reviewed and discussed in light of the Project Selection Criteria (above). Based on the feedback of the MPO Alternative Transportation Committee, MPO staff will present and discuss the MPO Alternative Transportation Committee's recommendation to the MPO Technical Committee. Once the MPO Technical Committee has reviewed and discussed the recommendation, MPO staff will submit a draft TAP project(s) to the MPO Technical Committee for recommendation to the MPO Policy Committee. If approved, the MPO Technical Committee will make a recommendation to the MPO Policy Committee.

Step 4 - Policy Committee Review and Approval: The MPO Policy Committee will review the proposed candidates or changes and recommendations. The MPO Policy Committee will then take an official action based on staff and Technical Committee recommendations and render a decision.

Step 5 – TIP Programming: The action of the MPO Policy Committee will be incorporated by formal resolution via an amendment to the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and placed into the draft TIP for the coming fiscal year. The formal resolution, upon adoption by the MPO Policy Committee, will be forwarded to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT).
